CORE ELEMENTS (BASE FORMAT)



Author's Last Name

Page Number(s)



In MLA Style, referring to the works of others in your text is done using **parenthetical citations**. This method involves providing relevant source information in parentheses whenever a sentence uses a **quotation** or **paraphrase**. Usually, the simplest way to do this is to put all of the source information in parentheses at the end of the sentence (just before the period). However, there are situations where it makes sense to put the parenthetical elsewhere in the sentence, or even to leave information out.

No Author

Use first few words from title of source.

In-text Citation

Omit page number(s).

In-text Citation

Separate sources using a semicolon (;).
